## Section - B

### 1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

#### a) To provide quality education:

Shriman Bhausaheb Zadbuke Mahavidyalaya, Barshi is affiliated to Solapur University, Solapur which was established in 1969. College offers wide range of subject choices in Arts and Science faculty at undergraduate level. In addition our college offers Yashvantrao Chavan Open University courses in Arts and Commerce. Within the framework of the regulation of the State Government and to meet the changing requirements of the job market, the college has initiated self-funded courses like BBA and BCA.

Syllabi of UG programme designed by Solapur University, Solapur are followed by our college. However many teachers who are members of the Board of Studies and other academic bodies of the University, have been playing active role in the formation and revision of syllabi in different subjects. So the teachers recruited by selection committee are of high standard. Quality is given top priority during the selection of the teachers. The Teachers update and upgrade their knowledge through orientation and refresher courses, Minor Research Projects (MRP), Publication, M.Phil., Ph.D. etc.

Strong current of excellence flows in our college. Research activities of Dr. B.P. Kale (Philosophy), Dr. S.W. Kulkarni (Microbiology), Dr. R.G. Bidkar (Chemistry), Dr. P.N. Patrawale (Physics), Dr. G.R. Kashid (Hindi) are worth-noting. Their work has been cited by numerous researchers.

Apart from this creditable achievement of the teachers, Prof M.B. Gadekar, Prof V. P. Lingayat, Prof N. R. Danane have registered for Ph.D., Prof. J.P. Zadbuke submitted his Ph.D. work and some of the teachers have attended orientation and refresher courses under UGC’s Faculty Development Programmes (FDP).

Teachers’ commitment to the teaching and research is unquestionable, as they have deep commitment to society which is

reflected by their involvement in various social activities such as members of Marathi Vidnyan Parishad, Indian Red-Cross society, Ethical Committee, Cancer Hospital Barshi, etc.

Student-teacher interaction, Parent-teacher Association meetings and feedbacks from students bring out not only our strengths but also our weaknesses. This helps us to strengthen our strengths and weaken our weaknesses and paves the way for quality enhancement of our college.

### **(b) To introduce Career-Oriented Courses**

To face the challenges of competitive world, job oriented courses are must for the students, so our college started BBA and BCA during last year. As a natural growth second year BBA and BCA is started. As these are professional courses, they make the students confident and well-equipped with professional knowledge in computers and management. We have well qualified faculty and well equipped air conditioned computer laboratory, students and teachers use internet facility to update their knowledge. We purchase latest softwares for the benefit of teachers and students. This no-grant course is useful for generating financial resources for the growth and development of the college. These courses being job oriented have gained popularity. As a result, there is increased flow of students for the courses.

Job oriented courses have been introduced at +2 level under Minimum Competency Vocational Courses (MCVC). These courses are of great use for the students. The courses are run by our college are –

- i. Electronic Technology
- ii. Dairy Technology
- iii. Repair, Maintenance and Rewinding of Electrical Motors.

After completing these courses many students get jobs in factories and industry.

Career and Guidance cell of our college organizes variety of activities for the benefit of the students. Prof. V.P. Lingayat, the co-ordinator of this cell is regulating the system nicely. This cell is run under the head "*Spardha Pariksha Margadarshan Varg*". This year 27 students got the benefit of this career and guidance cell. Mr. Ganesh Veer got job of a constable in Mumbai Police.

**C) To develop responsible citizens owing loyalty to the preamble to the constitution of India. Justice, Liberty, Equality, Fraternity and Compassion.**

National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadet Corps (NCC) are quite active in the college. NCC Cadets are encouraged to participate in different type of camps held at different places on regional, state and national levels. Some of the camps include Annual Training Camp (ATC), National Integration Camp (NIC), Army Attachment Camp (AAC) etc. NCC Cadets have deep commitment towards society, which is reflected in their involvement in Blood donation Camp and tree plantation programme etc.

The motto of NSS is “Service to Humanity”. This motto is reflected in their activities like special camping programme, blood donation camp, tree plantation programme etc. During special camping programmes student volunteers (boys and girls) stay in the adopted village for ten days. They stay together, work together, dine together, organize cultural activities together, this togetherness helps them to develop equality, fraternity and compassion among themselves.

The Parent-Teacher Association, Alumni Association etc. are the attempt, to bridge the gap and establish communal harmony. We strive to celebrate national days, commemorate national heroes and other eminent personalities from various fields. Students organize send off function for the final year students and welcome function for the first year students. The retired persons are felicitated along with their life partners by offering suitable gifts. Study tours are organized by the Departments of Chemistry, Microbiology, Zoology and Geography. Study tours help the students to widen the horizons their knowledge.

The sports department of our college is active and vibrant. Our students take part in various sports activities. Miss. Prajakta P. Deshpande and Miss. Priyanka Bokefode of B.B.A.-II class are selected for Solapur University Basket Ball team. Mr. Somnath Khatal of B.A.-III represented our college in University Soft Ball team. Several other students represented our college at university level. Outstanding sports persons are given sports kits as an incentive. Sports and games inculcate a sense of sportsmanship among the students. The sense of sportsmanship is very useful to the students in the latter part of their life.

We have tea club for teachers run by non-teaching staff. During tea break all teachers come together and have informal discussion on variety of academic issues. This intellectually stimulating interaction takes place in healthy atmosphere. This enriches the knowledge which is very useful to all teachers. Parent-teacher association, Alumni Association help us to bridge the gap and establish communal harmony.

There is also a cooperative credit society of our Mandal which lends loan to needy employees.

**D) To develop all-round personality of the students:**

Several associations e.g. Social Science Association, Language Association, Science Association etc provide ample scope for the personality development and character building among the students, speeches of resource persons inspire the students to be successful in their lives. Motivation they get from the speeches helps them to have big dreams in their lives and strive to realize them. The students' hidden talents get boost to the maximum. Thus these Associations have larger role to play in shaping the personalities of the students.

Personality development is not built overnight. It is slow and steady process. Admitted students stay in the college for a period of five years. (i.e. two years at Junior College and three years at Senior College). Our college has rich past, relevant present and hopeful future. Traditions and ethos have been paying an important role in providing quality education in our college. National Service Scheme (NSS), National Cadets Corps (NCC) and Cultural department are active and vibrant. Civic responsibility and social commitments are fostered through activities of NSS, NCC and Cultural departments. Special camp at adopted village, tree plantation, blood donation camps etc. are regular features of NSS. Apart from regular NCC parades, cadets are deeply involved in social activities such as blood donation, AIDS awareness, No-tobacco Day etc.

Thus civic responsibility and social commitments are fostered through the activities organized by NSS and NCC.

Education without values is like flower without fragrance. So we give our students value based education by organizing guest lectures on Gandhi Jayanti, University Foundation Day, NSS Day, Teachers Day etc. We know that the values inculcated in the formative years of life are lasting and permanent. By organizing guest lectures on various topics of social relevance, we try to put in young and impressionable minds the qualities such as honesty, integrity, love for the nation, respect for the parents and elders. Such inspiring speeches can fire the imagination of our students and can change the lives of the students.

Apart from sowing the seeds of values among the students, we build their academic career in a beautiful way. The well established guidance and council cell organizes variety of activities for the benefit of students. Prof. V.P. Lingayat, Assistant Professor of Marathi, and the coordinator of this cell is regulating the system in wonderful way. Some

motivated and inspired students appear for competitive examinations such as Union Public Service Commission (UPSC), Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC) and Bank Recruitment Examinations etc. External experts are invited to interact with our students. This intellectually stimulating interaction helped the students to fare well in the examination. Selected students are employed in different fields. These students remain in touch with their Alma mater. Thus apart from values we build their academic career also. The college takes care of student's all-round development.

Cultural Department of our college is very strong. Students' participation in University Youth Festival is regular affair. Our college is known for bagging prizes in many events. We got prizes for Pantomime and Mimicry. Prof. V.S. Sabale and Prof. M.B. Gadekar took lot of efforts in guiding the participants.

College is vibrating with many co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Eighty one (81) students participated in essay competitions, three winners in this competition were given prizes. An exhibition on "Indian Literacy persons of Hindi Subject" was inaugurated by an Administrative Officer Dr. D. P. Mane. 'Hindi Day' was organized for which chief guest was Mr. Abdul Sattar Daruwala, Assistant Manager, State Bank of India, Barshi.
