Section - B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

a) To provide quality education

Our college has research potential and it promotes research by encouraging, motivating and supporting teachers to undertake research activities. Four teachers have Minor Research Projects (MRP) to their credit. They have received UGC grants for their research activities. Dr. G. R. Kashid has received Rs. 1,35,000/- MRP grants for the project “Hindi Mahila Lekhikati Atmakathanaka Mulyankan”. Similarly Mr. V. P. Lingayat, Lecturer in Marathi, Mr. M. B. Gadekar, Lecturer in English, Mr. V. H. Waghmare, Lecturer in English also have received UGC’s MRP grants. One Mr. H. S. Patil, Lecturer in Statistics has completed his Ph. D. from Solapur University, Solapur. Some teachers have published research paper in journals of national repute. They are the assets of our institution. They are Dr. R. G. Bidkar, Dr. P. N. Patrwale, Dr. B. P. Kale, Dr. S. B. Ghugare, Dr. S. W. Kulkarni and Dr. G. R. Kashid. Thus teachers with enriched knowledge contribute to the quality of education richly.

We have a well-established Guidance and counseling unit organizing variety of activities for the benefit of students. It is run under the head “Spardha Pariksha Margadarshan Varg”. The co-ordinator Mr. V. P. Lingayat is regulating the system nicely. This year 38 students were benefited by the guidance and counseling unit.

Quality of education we provide is reflected in the various university examinations, number of students have figured in the merit list of university examinations. Miss. Swaranjali Waghmare stood first in the university and Mr. Jainuddin Mujawar stood second in the university examination in B. Sc.

The college is well known for its extension activities. Being service oriented institution it has adopted nearby village and rendered significant service for their development.

Well equipped and enriched library, excellent gymnasium, air-conditioned computer laboratory, spacious play ground etc are some of the salient features of our college. All these speaks volumes of about the quality of education we provide.

b) To introduce Career-Oriented Courses

As we know that professional courses make the students confident and well-equipped with professional knowledge in Computers and Management. Also to service

in this cut-throat competitive world, job-oriented courses are must for the students. Accordingly, our college introduced University approved job-oriented course – they are Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) and Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA). We have well qualified faculty and well-equipped air-conditioned laboratory. Students and teachers use internet facility to update their knowledge. We also purchase latest software for the benefit of teachers and students. This no-grant course is useful for generating financial resources for the growth and development of the college.

The Under Graduate (U. G.) programmes i.e. BBA / BCA were initiated to cater to the needs of I. T. industry and business interested academic consumers. These courses being job-oriented have gained popularity. As a result of this there is increased flow of students for the courses.

Job oriented courses have been introduced at plus-2 level, under Minimum Competency Vocational Course (MCVC). These courses are of great use for the students to get job after +2 level. The course run by our college are

- i) Electronic Technology
- ii) Dairy Technology
- iii) Repair, Maintenance and Rewinding of Electrical Motors

After successful completion of these courses students get jobs in factories and industry.

Variety of activities are organized by career and guidance cell for the benefit of students. Mr. V. P. Lingayat, Co-ordinator of this cell is doing exceedingly well in this respect. During this year 38 students were benefited by guidance and counseling cell.

C) To develop responsible citizens owing loyalty to the preamble to the constitution of India. Justice, Liberty, Equality, Fraternity and Compassion.

Our college is proficient in sports and games. Students of our college take part in various sports activities. Gymkhana Department motivates and encourages the students to participate in various sports activities. In swimming Mr. Shailesh Patil of B. A. Part I student was selected in the University team. Similarly Mr. Pramod Sawant, B. A. Part I and Mr. Deodhare D.A. were selected in the University team in soft ball and lawn tennis respectively.

Our students' performance in these games is highly commendable, sports and game inculcate a sense of sportsmanship among the students. This sense of sportsmanship is very useful to the students in the latter part of their life.

We have vibrant National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadets Corps (NCC) units in our college. NSS volunteers organize special camps at adopted village. Volunteers work among the village community to promote awareness of cleanliness and environment protection and pollution control. NCC cadets apart from regular parades involve themselves in campus cleaning activities. One hundred NSS volunteers stay in adopted village for ten day during special camp programme. They stay together, work together, dine together organize cultural functions together, this sense of togetherness helps them to develop friendship among them. Here students experience Equality, Fraternity and compassion.

Cultural Department along with NSS and NCC organize so many socially oriented programmes such as community development, social work, health, environment awareness, AIDS awareness programmes, blood donation camps etc. All these activities are good training ground for shaping the responsible future citizens of the country.

College tea club is run by a peon of our college. During tea break all teachers come together and have informal discussion on variety of academic and non-academic issues. This intellectually stimulating interaction takes place in health atmosphere. This interaction enriches everybody's knowledge which is very useful to all teachers.

Alumni Association, Parents-teacher Association, Science Association, Language Associations etc help to bridge gap and establish communal harmony. We also celebrate national days – 26th January and 15th August. Birth and death anniversaries of freedom fighters and patriots are celebrated to inculcate a sense of sacrifice among the students. In addition, these are valedictory function for the final year students and welcome function for the first year students. Co-operative credit society of our institution lends loan to needy employees. In this way we develop responsible future citizens of the country.

D) To develop all-round personality of the students

Our college has rich past, relevant present and hopeful future. Tradition and ethos have been playing an important role in providing quality education in our college. National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadets Corps (NCC) and Cultural department are active and vibrant in our college. Civic responsibility and social commitments are fostered through activities of NSS, NCC and cultural departments.

Language Association, Social Science Association, Service Association etc provide ample scope for the personality development and character building among the students. By actively participating in the Associations, students personality is developed. Some students become silver tongued orators, some become authors some scientists. In this way their personality is groomed, students develop their personality by choice not by chance.

We give our students value based education by organizing guest lectures on university foundation day, NSS day, Gandhi Jayanthi etc. Values inculcated in college days are lasting and permanent.
